Provost's Awards for Faculty Excellence and Impact: 2024 Call for Nominations

The Office of the Provost is pleased to invite nominations for the 2023-2024 Provost's Awards for Faculty Excellence and Impact by **Friday, November 17**th, **2023**. Key information for this awards cycle includes:

- Faculty may nominate their colleagues. Faculty may not self-nominate.
- One award will be made in each award category.
- Nominees can only receive one award across the Faculty Excellence and Impact Award categories in any given year.
- Past awardees for any given category are not eligible for the same award in subsequent years.
- The renomination of faculty who were previously nominated but did not receive an award is encouraged.

Awardees will receive a monetary prize, distributed for each award category as detailed below, and a commemorative plaque. Winners will be announced at the celebratory reception on May 1st, 2024, 5pm-7pm. All finalists and their nominator, chair, dean, and guest will be invited to attend.

Award Categories and Eligibility

1. James M. Tien Early Career Award and Grant

<u>Description</u>: The James M. Tien Early Career award recognizes faculty who have made significant contributions early in their career. At the forefront of their field, the faculty member's academic record should reflect ongoing and exceptional growth in contribution to their discipline and the University.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Full-time University Faculty who have been in a tenure-track position at UM for at least three years and have completed their terminal degree (e.g., Ph.D.) within the last ten years. For faculty who have been granted a University-approved extension to their pre-tenure probationary review period, the length of time of that extension shall not count toward the calculation of their ten years of professional experience. <u>Award Amount</u>: \$1,000 as a cash prize and \$5,000 for a discretionary account to support the awardee's work.

<u>Nomination Guidance</u>: The nominator's statement should, (a) be written for a general academic audience (avoid jargon), (b) provide a snapshot of the nominee's reputation in their field and how they stand out from their peer scholars (use specific examples), and (c) speak to the faculty member's promise in moving their discipline forward and the anticipated impact their work will have in their discipline and beyond.

2. Lifetime Achievement Award

<u>Description</u>: The Lifetime Achievement award recognizes the eminent careers of faculty who have demonstrated sustained extraordinary contributions to their field and have enhanced the reputation of the University through their notable accomplishments.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Full-time Regular Faculty and Research Faculty who have been at the rank of Full Professor for at least ten years, have at least ten years of service at UM, and have conducted a large portion of their scholarship at UM.

<u>Award Amount</u>: \$5,000 as a cash prize or a discretionary fund to support the awardee's work.

<u>Nomination Guidance</u>: The nominator's statement should, a) be written for a general academic audience (avoid jargon), (b) provide a snapshot of the nominee's reputation in their field and how they stand out from their peer scholars (use specific examples), and (c) speak to how the faculty member's work has moved their discipline forward and impacted the world.

3. Outstanding Achievement in Research and Scholarship

<u>Description</u>: The Outstanding Achievement in Research and Scholarship Award recognizes faculty who have contributed a single unique, high-impact scholarly contribution to their field or research program.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Full-time Regular Faculty and Research Faculty at any rank who have at least three years of service at UM.

Award Amount: \$1,000 as a cash prize or discretionary fund to support the awardee's work.

Nomination Guidance: Nominator's statement should (a) be written for a general academic audience (avoid jargon), (b) speak to ONE single academic achievement (e.g., publication, grant, discovery, patent, book) that has been hugely impactful, (c) describe how the single academic achievement has impacted the nominee's standing in their field and has situated the nominee apart from their peers (provide specific examples), (d) speak to how the achievement moved their discipline forward, and the specific impact the work has had or will have on their discipline (e.g., a future breakthrough) and/or the world.

4. Outstanding Achievement in the Arts, Music, and Creative Disciplines

<u>Description</u>: The Outstanding Achievement in the Arts, Music, and Creative Disciplines recognizes faculty who have contributed a single unique, high-impact creative contribution in the arts, music, or other creative discipline.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Full-time University Faculty at any rank who have at least three years of service at UM.

<u>Award Amount</u>: \$1,000 as a cash prize or discretionary fund to support the awardee's work.

<u>Nomination Guidance</u>: Nominator's statement should (a) be written for a general academic audience (avoid jargon), (b) speak to ONE single creative achievement (e.g., a specific musical recording, work of art, performance, film, architectural design) that has been hugely impactful, (c) describe how the single creative achievement has impacted the nominee's standing in their field and has situated the nominee apart from their peers (provide specific examples), (d) speak to how the achievement moved their discipline forward and the specific impact the creative achievement has had or will have on their discipline and/or the world.

5. Excellence in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

<u>Description</u>: The Excellence in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion award recognizes faculty who have made exceptional contributions to advance diversity, equity, and inclusion at UM. The faculty member should reflect the ideals of DEI and have supported efforts beyond their primary responsibilities to enhance DEI in their teaching, service/outreach, research, scholarship, or creative works.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Full-time University Faculty and Lecturers at any rank who have at least three years of service at UM.

Award Amount: \$1,000 as a cash prize or discretionary fund to support the awardee's work.

<u>Nomination Guidance:</u> Nominator's statement should speak to how the faculty member's contributions to DEI go above and beyond their regular duties.

6. Distinguished University Citizen

<u>Description</u>: The Distinguished University Citizen award recognizes faculty who have demonstrated outstanding citizenship and institutional building through dedicated academic service to the University community. The faculty member should exemplify deep commitment to service and embody UM's DIRECCT Values.

<u>Eligibility</u>: Full-time University Faculty at the rank of Associate or Full Professor who have at least ten years of service at UM and Lecturers who have at least ten years of service at UM.

Award Amount: \$1,000 as a cash prize or discretionary fund to support the awardee's work.

<u>Nomination Guidance:</u> Nominator's statement should speak to (a) the faculty member's University-wide service and the impact the service has had on the University as a whole (and

not just their particular unit), and (b) how the faculty member's selfless service to the University goes beyond their regular duties.

Nominations

Nominators will be asked to provide the following:

- Nominee biography (no more than half a page, 12-point font, single spaced)
- Nomination statement describing why the nominee is worthy of the award (no more than one page, 12-point font, single spaced, see 'Nomination Guidance' under each award category for what should be addressed)

Nominations will be made through Qualtrics, where nominators will be asked to upload the biography and the nomination statement, and provide the nominee's full name, title, years of service at UM, preferred pronouns, school, department, UM email, and UM phone number.

Important Dates

Nominations must be submitted by **11:59pm November 17**th, **2023**. Nominations will be reviewed by School/College leadership who will select final nominees for review by University-wide review committees. Finalists will be notified by the Office of the Provost and will be asked to submit a CV, their own one-page statement on why they should win the award, and a sample of their scholarly (e.g., publication) or creative work (e.g., musical composition). Awardees will be announced at the celebratory reception on May 1st, 2024, 5pm – 7pm. Save the date!
